ENVIRONMENTAL MATTERS

LARGE TREES ON COUNCIL LAND

There have been several local incidents where large trees and/or branches on council land have fallen and damaged private properties. Two local residents told MPA that their claims to council for paying their damages were declined as there were no prior notifications or maintenance requests received by the council regarding the trees. In view of this, should you have any concerns about a similar incident that may occur to you or pose a risk to others, we recommend you report to Brisbane City Council.





RIDING MOTORISED BIKES IN THE PARK

The MPA has recently received reports of people riding motorised dirt bikes in the Biami Yumba Park (near the picnic tables at the corner of Ormsby and Kenny Streets). Heavy tyre marks and damage to the grass and the mulching were noted. MPA wishes to note that riding motorbikes in the park is prohibited and it causes damage to a fragile ecosystem and might lead to injuries to individuals who use the park.

ADVOCACY

The committee will continue to pursue further the issues highlighted on the page. On 20 January, Cr James Mackay came to inspect the fence at the lagoon and we took the chance to have a walk around the neighbourhood to follow up on a few issues. James will speak to the council about a set of steps, eliminating the steep, slippery path towards the back paddock. A concrete path from Gan-Gani CK to Biami Yumba Park is in the process of funding approval. The rather ugly black metal fence is a quick fix and will be updated to better suit the environment in time. James suggested to plant trees in the dog off leash area. The massive algae and water hyacinth in the lagoon are causing a real concern. We have requested James to look into these urgently.



has always been a concern on the section of FTP Road between Botticelli Street and Ormsby Street. The committee has recently received a report of a near miss of a child running across FTP Road. We took the chance to raise it with James. He mentioned the creation of more car parking spaces encroaching into the park will not be supported by council as they want to maintain the size of the park. The extension of a yellow line would cause a number of other issues including people parking on the other side which would be an issue for children getting out of cars there. The committee is keen to hear any suggestions you may have to address the issues. In the meantime, we ask that you please take extra care especially when the park is busy.

COMMUNITY GARDEN:

James is aware of MPA's interest in having a community garden and is keen to know where we may wish to have it. Two suggested locations A & B for this are marked on map above.
